**“DISARMAMENT –  
PROSPECTS, POSSIBILITIES AND POTENTIAL PITFALLS”**

United Nations disarmament chief Angela Kane will give an account of recent disarmament achievements - and look towards those that may lie ahead (including hopes for the Arms Trade Treaty and an assessment of the prospects for nuclear disarmament).

Angela Kane is the United Nations High Representative for Disarmament Affairs. In that capacity, she leads the United Nations Office for Disarmament Affairs. Prior to this appointment in 2012, Ms Kane held a wide range of senior positions in the United Nations during a long career in the Organisation. She was Under-Secretary-General for Management, following a term as Assistant Secretary-General for Political Affairs. She has also held leadership positions in peacekeeping and public information, and worked on disarmament issues earlier in her career in relation to the World Disarmament Campaign.
