Marine and Coastal Area (Takutai Moana) Bill

Public submissions are being invited on this bill. The closing date for submissions is Friday, 19 November 2010.

The committee intends to travel widely to hear submissions on the bill, to locations including Invercargill, Christchurch, Blenheim, Wellington, Bay of Plenty, Hamilton, Auckland and Whangarei. "This is an issue that a lot of New Zealanders feel strongly about. We want to hear from all people who have an interest in the foreshore and seabed of New Zealand" said Hon Tau Henare, Chairperson of the Māori Affairs Select Committee.

The bill aims to reform the law relating to ownership of the foreshore and seabed following a review of the Foreshore and Seabed Act 2004 which was completed in June 2009. The bill defines a "common marine and coastal area" which means the marine and coastal area other than specified freehold land (land already in private ownership) and conservation areas and reserves and "the bed of Te Whaanga Lagoon in the Chatham Islands" and provides that "neither the Crown nor any other person owns, or is capable of owning, the common marine and coastal area". The bill aims to give legal recognition, protection and expression to the customary interests of Māori over the common marine and coastal area. The bill details various public rights and powers over this area, such as public rights of access, navigation and fishing.
